

Year 8 students have been <u>learning about Earth and the materials we obtain from our</u> <u>planet</u>. This was an interesting topic where we were able to celebrate Earth Day first by studying the different layers of Earth.

As part of this, we created **models made out of plasticine to represent the different layers.** We then studied the three different types of rocks and to understand the origin of igneous rocks, we created volcanoes from papier mache and painted them. We also learnt how different types of igneous rocks are formed depending on where they cool down.

The students enjoyed making, painting and presenting the models to their peers to demonstrate their knowledge about igneous rocks.
