Kelvin and Wyke Shared Access Road

Please note that parents and carers should not stop their vehicles or park on this shared access road. This causes hazards for other drivers, our students, and our staff. 


Y7 Table Tennis Team Triumphs at Regional Finals!


Waves of Wonder - Hull Maritime Exhibition at the Ferens Art Gallery

Pupils in the KS3 History club at Kelvin Hall School have recently had their activities showcased in a Hull Maritime exhibition at the Ferens Art Gallery. The exhibition entitled 'Waves of Wonder' was the culmination of creative activities undertaken by young people across the city on a local history maritime theme.

Pupils at Kelvin Hall chose to focus on Hull General Cemetery in our local area and its connections to the city's maritime businesses and an important site for remembering our heritage. One of the monuments there belongs to John Gravill, captain of Hull's last whaling ship, The Diana. Gravill captained the ship on

her ill-fated voyage to the Arctic where she was trapped in ice for over six months while the crew faced disease and starvation. He and 12 others lost their lives. The voyage was the last time any whaling ship would sail from Hull.

Pupils from Kelvin Hall School's History Club worked with Miss Newton to explore the life of Captain Gravill and the history of The Diana to research and design a public information board. Bringing together historical facts with the pupils' own artwork, sharing this important part of Hull's maritime heritage in a new and creative way.
