We are thrilled to share that, since switching to Arbor, 96% of parents and carers have successfully been using the Arbor app. The Arbor app is an excellent resource for monitoring your child's attendance, behaviour, booking appointments for Progress Evenings, and more. We also use it to send important messages home, a feature we will increasingly rely on.

When receiving an Arbor message, if that communication is not open in the app within a certain time (usually 2 hours), then you will receive a text. This is to ensure that all messages reach parents and carers.
