Uniform Expectations

School uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of Kelvin Hall and setting the appropriate tone. In common with most schools in England, we have a school uniform and rules on appearance that we require all students to follow.

School shoes must be black, plain and formal, we do not allow any trainers regardless of colour.

A polite reminder that students are not allowed to wear jewellery to school, this includes necklaces, bracelets, and rings. Any items seen will be confiscated and students will receive these items back at the end of the day.

Students are allowed to wear one small stud in each ear lobe, hoop earrings and large earrings are not allowed and will also be confiscated. Furthermore, false nails and false eyelashes are not permitted, and must be removed.

Students who fail to meet these expectations will receive sanctions.
